



VALOR CHRISTIAN SCHOOL INTERNATIONAL COVID-19 FAQs

Commonly asked Valor Parent Questions:

I'm looking for an in-person school option for my kids. When will Valor reopen on campus?

Valor Christian School International (VCSI) Beaverton has developed plans in three phases that follow the requirements set forth by Governor Brown. Each phase includes some in-person opportunities. We will begin the year in Phase 1 which includes cohorts of 10 students on campus for 2-hour blocks. We intend to move to Phase 2 and Phase 3 as soon as we meet the required metrics outlined by the Oregon Health Authority. It is our goal to fully reopen 5-days a week on campus as soon as we can. I have multiple students at Valor. Will their cohort meet during the same 2-hour time block?

We will strive to first group students by family, then carpool group to help with transportation coordination.

Will Valor stay in hybrid distance learning for the full first trimester?

We believe that in-person instruction provides students with the best opportunities for growth spiritually, emotionally, and academically. Because of this aspiration, we will move through phases as soon as possible, even within a trimester.

When Valor moves to full reopening, will we still have a virtual learning option?

Once we advance to Phase 3, we will no longer be offering a virtual learning option at VCSI Beaverton. If you would like a guaranteed online option for the first trimester, we recommend that you transfer to [Valor Global Online](#) (VGO). Valor Global Online is a separate school from VCSI, it has staff and students from all over the world enrolled. When transferring please note your students will change teachers, curriculum and peer group. VGO has limited spaces available, please check in with Ashley.pleasant@valorschool.org if you have interest in this option.

I'm not ready to send my kids to school in-person right now. What are my options?

While Phase 1 includes the option for 2-hour in-person cohorts on campus, these are not required. All materials covered during the in-person times will be posted and supported by teachers online.

I'm not ready to send my kids to school in-person for the first trimester.

If you would like a guaranteed online option for the full first trimester, you can transfer to VGO (as space permits) and then return to VCSI Beaverton at the end of the term. You will complete the VCSI

Beaverton enrollment process and pay the VCSI Beaverton tuition to reserve your seat in future trimesters. Contact Ashley.pleasant@valorschool.org if you have further questions.

I'm looking for an online option for the full school year.

We recommend that you transfer to Valor Global Online (VGO). VGO is a separate school offering an online education with the same One-2-One mission. You can learn more about the course catalog, sample schedule and tuition on the [VGO website](#).

I'm not ready to send my kids to school in-person, but I want them to stay with their friends and teachers. Is there a hybrid option where some kids can be in person and some online?

We have tried hybrid classes and despite our best efforts, the quality for the online learner did not meet our high standards. We are committed to maintaining a standard of excellence and as such will not offer a synchronous hybrid option once VCSI returns to campus. You may transfer to Valor Global Online (VGO) and your student will join that fantastic community.

I'm not ready to send my kids to school in-person but I want them to stay with their friends and teachers. Can we start the trimester at VCSI Beaverton and when it moves to in-person learning in Phase 2 or 3 then transfer to VGO?

We ask that you transition between VCSI Beaverton and VGO at trimester breaks which are every 12 weeks. This will be easier on your child to maintain continuity in curriculum. If you would like a guaranteed online option for the first trimester, we recommend that you start the year at VGO.

Why would I pay the higher VCSI Beaverton tuition if my student transfers to VGO for the first trimester?

In order to reserve your seat in VCSI Beaverton, we ask that you pay the tuition to cover some of the costs of saving that seat on campus. While that student is technically occupying a space in VGO and holding an open space in VCSI Beaverton, we are only charging tuition for one of those spaces.

Why would I pay the same tuition for a brick-and-mortar school if we are learning online?

A subsidized tuition rate is offered to keep Valor's education accessible. The actual cost of education is outlined in our Tuition and Fees summary. As such, most of our costs are the same whether we are online or in-person. For example, VCSI Beaverton continues to pay to lease the brick-and-mortar space whether we are able to occupy it or not.

Our data-driven approach, individualized learning plans and biblical worldview make Valor unique whether we're online or in-person. And unlike other schools, VCSI Beaverton offers live online classes in Phase 1. With our One-2-One model, part of your tuition payment includes an education scholarship for one child in a developing nation: Kenya, Haiti, and the Philippines.
